Holy Week



<u>Year 5 Dodgeball Tournament – Match report by Orson Williams</u>

On Wednesday 20th March 2024, a selection of ten students were chosen to go to the John Colet Secondary School for a dodgeball tournament. Unfortunately, two of the students chosen couldn't make it due to illness, so we had to play all the games with no substitutes.

We got ready at 9.30am (putting on Wendover Junior sports t-shirts and jackets), collected our snack and water bottle and off we went.

When we arrived, we saw all the other school teams, Stoke Mandeville, Aston Clinton and Halton, pulling up in a bus. (Halton and Aston Clinton both had two teams in the tournament).

Upon entering the school, we saw a wonderful mosaic of John Colet, the person whom the school was named after, above reception. After that, we walked through the school, and some of us said hello to family members.

We had a team photo when we arrived in the sports hall, then got ready to play. We were scheduled to play three, two-minute games against each opponent with a thirty second rest between games. Our longest rest was first so we could analyse each team's playing style before facing them.

Finally, it was our turn to play. For our first games we were on pitch two and won two games and lost one, so we gained one points for each win. Next, we were on pitch 1 and lost one game and drew two. We were awarded two further points for the two draws – so we were now on four points. We won three games to nil on pitch 1 after that – so we had seven points to our name.

At that stage we were in second, falling one point short of Aston Clinton B who had been the only team to beat us so far. It looked like our chances of coming first were dwindling since there were only two more rounds.

Against Aston Clinton A we won two games and lost one – so that put us on nine points in total. One win and two losses to Halton B nudged us up to 10 points. Everyone thought that Aston Clinton B had clinched the victory but when the scores were double-checked, they were also on 10 points!

The head of the competition, our old PE teacher Chris, declared a final showdown to decide the winner. We were exhausted, we had played 15 games by then without any substitutes and Aston Clinton B had two substitutes that they could play.

On the sound of the whistle, we charged for the balls. Everyone was cheering us on because we showed the most respect for our opponents by shaking their hands and demonstrating the 4Rs and 3Cs to the best of our ability. One three-minute game remained.

Halfway through and it looked like defeat was upon us with over half our players out and our opponents with only two players eliminated. Then... we caught one, then two, then three balls, knocking three of their players out and allowing three of ours to come back on. The full-time whistle went. We had won!

We walked back to school with a winning, jubilant attitude. We had all had fun, we'd been successful, saw friends and family from other schools and lived the WJS's values.






Doodle maths

As you know, we have provided online maths learning since September. The expectation is that all children complete up to 30 minutes of doodlemaths each week as extended learning (homework). This increases confidence and fluency, as well as giving them opportunities to develop good attitudes towards independent study.

We monitor time spent on doodlemaths each week. Whilst the whole school progress is good, some children are not engaging. Every child is expected to complete a minimum of 20 minutes per week – they can access doodlemaths through most devices. We provide additional support in school for anyone who has not engaged, allowing them to make up their time.



Uniform and PE Kit

Please remember that children need to wear a house-coloured t-shirt, black sport shorts and black knee length sports socks for PE. Additional layers may be worn outside in cold weather.
