Calling all Rhodium spellers!

It's nearly time for another WJS Spelling Challenge test (end of every half term). In addition to correctly spelling the 20 words in each list, Rhodium spellers also need to write 10 successful sentences. When they have written sentences which demonstrate a clear understanding of their 10 chosen words, by using each in the correct context (in addition to spelling all 20 words correctly), they are then ready to move up to the next word list.

We have created a 'how-to' sheet, which sets out our expectations for these sentences - including examples and non-examples. This is available on the school website, with the English resources. A copy has also been made available in school to each child who has reached this level of the Spelling Challenge.
